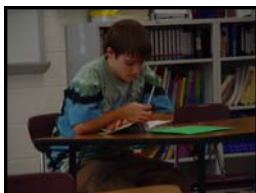
Pioneer Gives Back Through Financial Education

Pioneer WV Federal Credit Union has put together a two-week financial literacy course to be taught in area high schools. This program has been underway for approximately two months. The purpose of the course is to better prepare students with financial decisions now and in the future through classroom education.



During the two week course, we cover topics that include: *the importance of early savings and investment; debt management; how to manage a personal checking account; the different investment and insurance products that are available to them as consumers; how to read and understand a credit report; how to prepare for and what to expect when applying for a loan; as well as the importance of establishing a good credit history.*

Our first classes were conducted at South Charleston High School with two groups of business students.



When the classes came to a close there was an awards ceremony/pizza party for the students where we presented three lucky students with scholarships to help further their education as well as other awards for outstanding achievement.
